INTRODUCTION

Federalism—conceptually, legally, and administratively—remains one of the most complex and debated governance systems of our time. In Somalia, it occupies a particularly sensitive position at the heart of the national dialogue on unity, state-building, and equitable power sharing. Despite its promise, Somali federalism continues to face deep conceptual ambiguities, structural tensions, and weak institutional practice.

Since its adoption, Somalia has oscillated between the aspiration to build an inclusive system that enhances participation and equitable power distribution, and the reality of political fragmentation and localized loyalties. These contradictions have produced recurrent crises between the Federal Government and Member States, undermining national cohesion, governance effectiveness, and long-term stability.

Against this backdrop, the **Maqasid Center for Research and studies** at its Fifth Annual Conference, poses a pivotal question:

"Somalia's Federalism: Between Political Deadlock and the Search for Inclusive Partnership."

This question lies at the intersection of **good governance**, **national identity**, **and social justice**—principles central to the higher objectives (maqasid) of governance in Islamic jurisprudence. The jurisprudence of good governance (fiqh al-hukm al-salih) offers not only a framework for reflection but also a methodology for reform bridging normative principles with practical statecraft, and tradition with contemporary realities.

The conference seeks to move the debate beyond political rhetoric toward actionable scholarship and policy-oriented dialogue. It will explore how Somali federalism can evolve into a system that strengthens stability, justice, and inclusive national partnership, while drawing from both Islamic jurisprudential insights and comparative governance experiences.

- Shift the discourse from historical blame and fragmentation toward shared responsibility and future-oriented solutions.

- apers may be written in Arabic, Somali, or English.
 - Arabic: Sakkal Majella font, size 16 (main text), 12 (footnotes).
 - English/Somali: Times New Roman, size 12 (main text), 8 (footnotes), double spacing.
- Footnotes should be numbered independently.
- Sources and references must be listed at the end of the paper.
- Final papers should include clear findings and actionable recommendations.
- Papers should be between 15 and 30 pages.

- Selected papers will be published in the conference proceedings after peer review.
- Outstanding papers may be considered for publication in the Center's peer-reviewed journal.
